OVERVIEW

- Dimensional Sustainability Wealth Models are strategic asset allocations composed of Dimensional mutual funds and designed to put rigorous research to work across an investor’s portfolio.
- The Models pursue higher expected returns and reduced carbon footprint exposure, as well as reduced exposure to additional areas of sustainability concern.

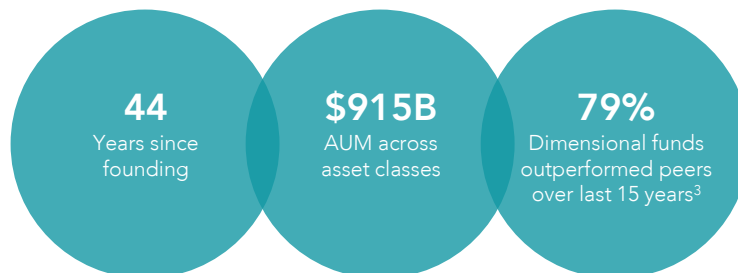

ESG is a term used to refer to environmental, social, and governance (ESG) practices when analyzing an investment. **Carbon Intensity** represents a company’s recently reported or estimated Scope 1 (direct) + Scope 2 (indirect) greenhouse gas emissions in carbon dioxide equivalents (CO₂e) normalized by sales in USD (metric tons CO₂e per USD million sales). Greenhouse gases included are carbon dioxide (CO₂), methane (CH₄), nitrous oxide (N₂O), hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs), sulfur hexafluoride (SF₆), and nitrogen trifluoride (NF₃). **Potential Emissions from Reserves** is a theoretical estimate calculated by MSCI of carbon dioxide produced if a company’s reported reserves of oil, gas, and coal were converted to energy, given estimated carbon and energy densities of the respective reserves. **Sector laggard** represents the companies with highest carbon intensity within each sector. **Sector leader** represents the companies with lowest carbon intensity within each sector. **Lower/higher carbon companies** represent companies with lower/higher carbon intensities and/or potential emissions from reserves.

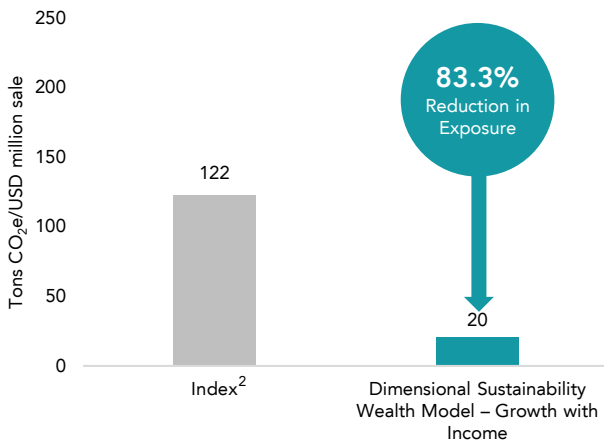
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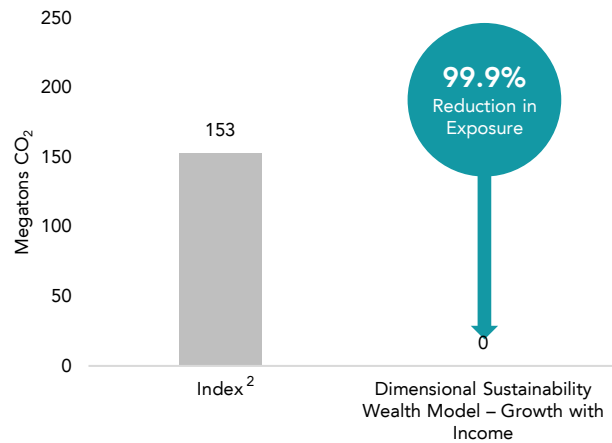

The internal Dimensional rating can only be as high as the highest stated credit rating from an NRSRO.

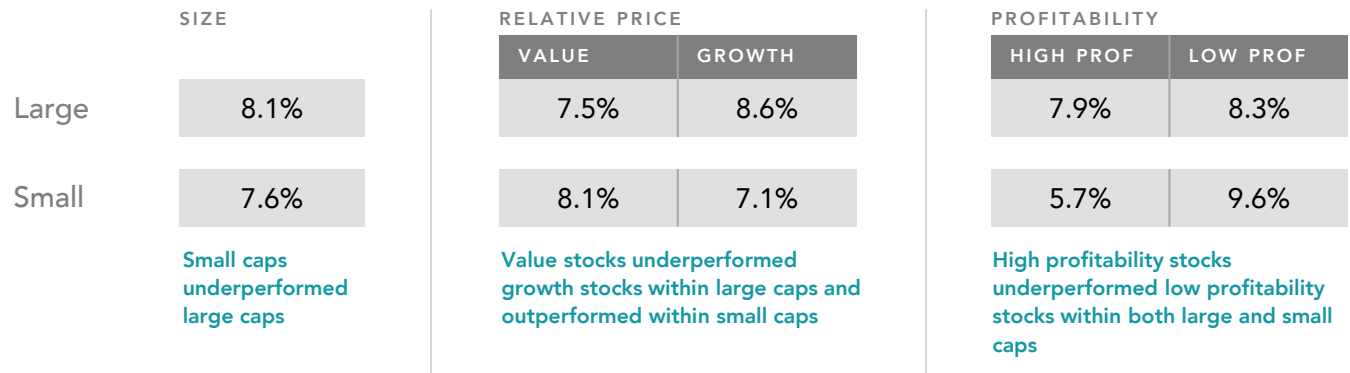

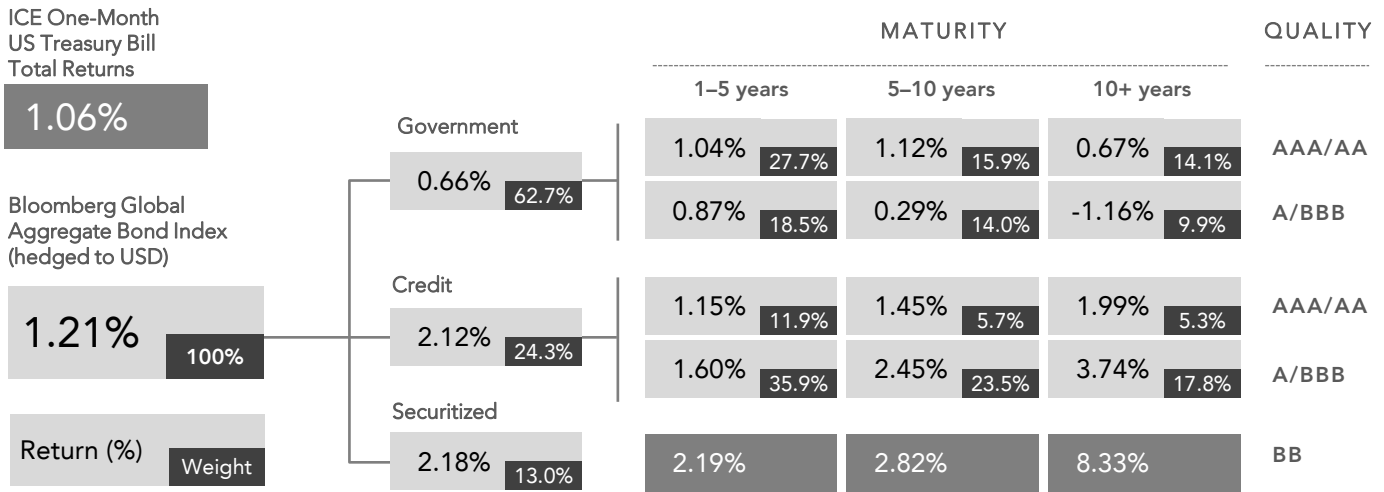

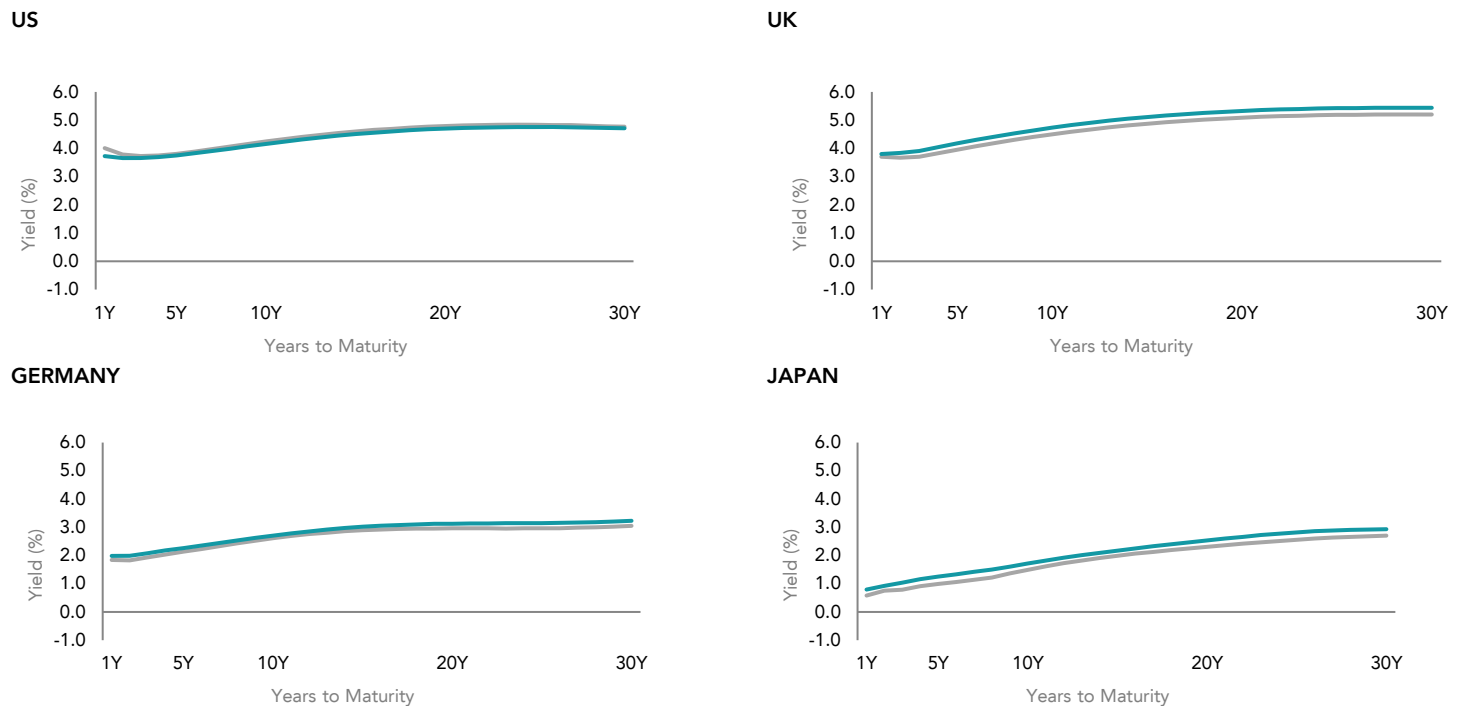

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GLOSSARY

Credit Premium: the return difference between bonds of similar maturity but different credit quality.

Effective Duration: measurement of the sensitivity of the price of a fixed income investment to changes in interest rate.

ETF: abbreviation for exchange-traded fund.

Expected Return: an estimate of average anticipated returns informed by historical data.

Market Capitalization: the total value of all shares of a company's stock, calculated by multiplying the price of a stock by its total number of outstanding shares.

Pre-Refunded Municipal: A municipal bond that has US Treasuries and other high-quality investments held in an escrow account to pay the bondholder. Typically, a municipal bond is pre-refunded prior to maturity and with proceeds from the same issuer's new bond.

Price-to-Book: the ratio of a firm's market value to its book value, where market value is computed as price multiplied by shares outstanding and book value is the value of stockholder equity as reported on a company's balance sheet

Profitability Premium: the return difference between stocks of companies with high profitability over those with low profitability.

Size Premium: the return difference between small capitalization stocks and large capitalization stocks.

Term Premium: the return difference between bonds with different maturities but similar credit quality.

Value Premium: the return difference between stocks with low relative prices (value) and stocks with high relative prices (growth).
